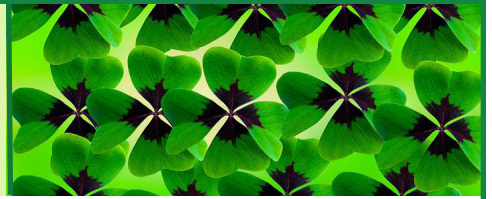

Hello St. Patrick's, I pray that all of you are and will continue to remain safe during this COVID-19 pandemic. Though we are physically distanced from one another, our love and care for one another and our neighbor has not diminished.

Welcome to our first newsletter which is designed to inform you of our parish's re-gathering status, the current state of our parish and general Diocesan news that affects us.

There is no question that these past few months have been challenging! The threat of COVID-19 to public health has turned our norms for daily living upside down. For us at St. Patrick's, it completely eliminated our ability to gather as a family. But, we are blessed to be able to use online technology to join services from sister churches locally, in other states and literally around the world.

Our Diocesan Bishop gave explicit requirements of and guidance to parishes on what is required to open our churches and re-gather for in-person worship. The foremost requirement is to form a Re-Entry Planning Committee: St. Patrick's Re-Entry Committee members are Janice Ellis, Jennifer Haynes (Chairperson), Jacquelyn Knowles, Delphine McDonald and Letitia Sharry. This committee will develop the Re-entry Plan. This plan will cover how our parish buildings and grounds will be sanitized, our service schedule, all aspects of how we worship in-person, church office operation, non-worship activities and technology enhancements. The key is to ensure that re-gathering at St. Patrick's is as safe and reverent as possible. The Plan will be submitted to the Bishop's office for review and approval. Once approved, the plan will be shared with you so that you can anticipate what will be required for safe re-entry.

Everyone is asked to complete the Congregational Re-Entry Survey and return it no later than Friday, June 26, 2020. You may access and submit it via our parish website (www.stpatricksepiscopalchurch.org) or fill the survey included with this Newsletter and use the enclosed envelope to mail it to the church. Your survey submission is anonymous. We must submit the survey results to the Diocese.

A document from the Diocese named "On Being Faithful" gives all of the requirements of and guidance to parishes, church schools and special ministries on what is required to resume its activities. As required by the Diocese, you can access a summary of and a PowerPoint presentation of "On Being Faithful" via our parish website. If you received this Newsletter by mail, the summary and PowerPoint presentation are included. Please read the documents.

A brief synopsis: Right now, because there continues to be spread of the virus in the West Palm Beach area, church buildings remain closed and services and meetings are being held online. Once there is a sustained reduction in new COVID-19 local cases for at least 14 days (and some other requirements are met), we can re-gather and worship at St. Patrick's. The Diocese calls this "Season 2". Please take a look at the "On Being Faithful" documents to see all of the requirements that have to be met for us to worship in-person as well as changes to how we worship. This way, you'll be prepared for our re-gathering in ways we could not have envisioned but which will become new ways of being in community.
